2025 Treasurer Report

Kootenay Boundary Branch AGM, October 28th, 2025.

1. Opening Remarks

Welcome to the Annual General Meeting of the BCIA Kootenay Branch. This report summarizes the financial activities and status of the branch for the 2025 fiscal year.

2. Account Summary

Opening Balance of \$4,660.00

- Branch allocation of 2,660
- Carryover from 2024 (max amount) 2,000

3. Budget:

- Professional Development events \$1200
- AGM (incl PD event, venue, catering and gifts) \$1450 (plus revenues from registration, tbd)
- Donations and Sponsorships: \$300.00
- Other expenses (travel subsidies, workshops, misc): \$500.00

Total of \$3450 budgeted – we are on track to have a higher balance than what we budgeted for.

\$4660 - \$3450 + event revenue = \$1210 + event revenue (tbd)

**Note that \$2000 is the maximum carryover from previous years.

3. Notes and Highlights

This year saw a modest increase in branch allocation based on number of registrants (133). Spending on PD events is likely to be lower than estimated, as it has been in past years. It is likely that the Kootenay branch will be in a position to carry over funds into the next fiscal year.

Beaver Dam Analogue restoration project. - September 26, 2025

The **Kootenay Boundary Branch** for a full-day field visit to the **Earl Ranch Conservation Lands** to explore **Beaver Dam Analogue (BDA) restoration projects**. This in-person tour provided registrants with the opportunity to see active restoration work, hear directly from experts, and discuss the role of BDAs in improving hydrologic resilience and habitat health.

The BC Wildlife Federation field team constructed 10 post-assisted BDAs, low-tech, channel-spanning features that mimic natural beaver dams. This tour gave registrants first-hand exposure to how BDAs function in practice, what restoration objectives are being met, and what challenges or maintenance needs have emerged. The exciting observation noted was the sign of 'Beaver chews' indicating 'if you build it they will come'.
